### **Attendance and Lateness**

I met with our Local Authority Attendance Officer this half term to discuss our whole school attendance figure

and discuss individual children whose overall percentage falls short of the Local Authority's target of 96%. Our current whole school attendance figure since September is 96.3%.

Please be reminded that your child's school day begins at 8:45am. As soon as the children enter the school building, their learning journey begins and every second counts. If your child arrives at 9am, they are missing key learning opportunities each day and over the weeks and months, the time soon adds up. They lose 1 hour and 15 minutes of learning each week!

Can I also remind you of the end of day timings. Nursery – Year 2 finish at 3:15pm and Year 3 – 6 finish at 3:20pm. A late pick up has an impact on staff who must wait with the children until they are picked up when they should be attending meetings or training. Please also be reminded that after school clubs finish at 4:30pm. Again, please be respectful of the staff's time and collect on time.
