And our very best wishes go with all of you.


## Staffing update

#### **Attendance and Lateness**

Our school target for attendance is set by the Local Authority at 96%. Our current whole school attendance figure since September is 96.55%. Attendance figure includes unauthorised absences, absences related to illness, medical appointments, and lateness. We must all work together to ensure children are in school providing they are well enough. Please find current class attendance below.

A reminder that your child's school day starts at 8:45am. Once the children enter the building, their learning begins, and every moment is important. If your child arrives at 9am, they miss out on valuable learning time - over a week, that's 1 hour and 15 minutes, and it adds up quickly over time.

Also, please note the end of day timings: Nursery to Year 2 finish at 3:15pm, and Year 3 to Year 6 finish at 3:20pm. Arriving late for pick-up affects staff, as they need to stay with the children when they should be in meetings or training. Lastly, after-school clubs end at 4:30pm - please be mindful of staff time and collect your child on time. Thank you for your cooperation!

#### **Free School Meals**

If your situation has changed, or you think you may be eligible for free school meals, please visit

school/free-school-meals/free-school-meals.aspx The application takes a couple of minutes to complete. Please do notify the school if you are eligible. Even if your child is in a class (Reception – Year 2) that receives a Government funded free school meal, it is still worth making an application as the school receives additional funding and we are also able to apply for supermarket vouchers for you. If you are eligible for free school meals and your child is in Year 2, you will need to reapply once your child moves into Year 3. Please be reminded that school dinners for children in Year 3 - 6 are £3.55 per meal. Dinners must be paid for in advance via SchoolGrid.
