Racial Equity Week

Last week, we dedicated time to Racial Equity Week, giving the children the opportunity to engage in thoughtful learning about the importance of inclusion, respect, and racial equity. Through discussions and activities, they considered how each of us can contribute to a fairer and more just society.



The week concluded with our participation in Show Racism the Red Card's Wear Red Day, where children and staff proudly wore red to show their support for this important cause. It was a powerful reminder of our commitment to standing against racism and promoting kindness, unity, and respect both within our school and beyond. Together, we raised £198 to support the charity's vital work.

Parent Partnership

We ended the half term with our parent consultations, and it was a real pleasure, along with our Governors, to speak with so many of you about your children's achievements and wider school life. Your support at the Book Fair was equally fantastic, an incredible £1727.33 worth of books were purchased (last year £1299.89), earning the school £1038.20 in commission (£714.94 last year) to spend on even more books for our children. It has been wonderful to see the children settling into the first half of the term and thriving in their new classes. More information will be shared with you all in due course on the progress of this transition. Governors and parents had the privilege of being invited to an uplifting and joyful Harvest Mass this month. It never fails to amaze us of how beautifully the children represent the school. Our school community is one of kindness and generosity and the donations made for the harvest were testament to this. Harvest Giving Project

Thank you for joining us for our Harvest Mass this half term. It was a wonderful first opportunity this school year to come together to thank God for all that we are blessed with and to consider how we can help those in need in our local community. Attendance and Lateness

Our school target for attendance is set by the Local Authority at 96%. Our current whole school attendance figure since September is 97%. Attendance figure includes unauthorised absences, absences related to illness, medical appointments, and lateness. I have spent a great deal of time recently completing leave of absence forms for families who have booked holidays during term time, and sadly, our attendance this week is the lowest it has ever been. This is such a shame when we work so hard to promote good attendance. I would like to sincerely thank the parents who always prioritise school attendance and never take holidays during term time - your support makes a real difference.



Some gentle reminders

Please remember the following guidelines, which aim to keep our school a safe place to be:

- Only park in designated spaces in the car park not along the hedge, yellow zig zag lines, in the open space near the entrance or in front of the school gates.
- All children must be accompanied by an adult through the car park. Children are encouraged to dismount their bike/scooter when entering the Stevenage FC carpark.
