Attendance and Lateness

Our school target for attendance is set by the Local Authority at 96%. Our current whole school attendance figure since September is 96.3%. Attendance figure includes unauthorised absences, absences related to illness, medical appointments, and lateness. We must all work together to ensure children are in school providing they are well enough. It should come as no surprise that there is a strong link between high levels of attendance and high attainment. Some parents have received attendance letters this term if their child's attendance is a cause for concern.

Please be reminded that your child's school day begins at

8:45am. As soon as the children enter the school building, their learning journey begins and every second counts. School begins at 8:45am. We have several children arriving closer to 9:00am.

These children are missing key learning opportunities each day. They lose 1 hour and 15 minutes of learning each week! Children who are regularly late can experience anxiety over coming into school after their peers are already in class. Additionally, developing good time-keeping is an important life skill for the future.

Please note that we have made applications this year to the Local Authority to issue fixed penalty notices to families when unauthorised absences have met the Local Authority's threshold.
